#### I. Call to Order

Mr. Bernahl called the meeting to order at 8:31 a.m. and a roll call was taken manually for attendance.

#### II. Approval of Meeting Minutes – October 14, 2021

Mr. Brennan moved approval of the October 14, 2021 meeting minutes. Mr. Rietveld seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

#### III. Agency Reports

#### a. Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP)

Ms. Weber announced that CMAP Staff has returned to the office. She reported on a number of initiatives underway at CMAP: a regional safety action agenda; a draft bicycle and pedestrian position paper; and a regional data project that will analyze speeding. She highlighted several upcoming funding opportunities such as Invest in Cook, IDOT bureau of safety and engineering for sustained traffic enforcement program, non-enforcement safety, motorcycle awareness, pedestrian and bicycle safety, racial profiling, traffic records, and distracted driving enforcement.

#### b. IDOT Local Roads

Mr. Fierro provided an update on the local roads & streets status sheet for federal aid projects. Mr. Fierro also stated that submissions to IDOT should be done so electronically unless a hard copy is specifically requested.

#### c. IDOT Highways

No report.

#### d. Illinois Tollway

Ms. Passi updated the committee on the Tollway's 2021 accomplishments, including: aiding 24,000 customers with roadways team emergency roadside services; serving 2 million customers with industry lead paid by plate; expanding the I-PASS assist program; helping customers realize \$130 million in savings through amnesty efforts; completing the 10<sup>th</sup> year of move Illinois program on schedule; and, developing their 2022 budget, all while engaging with stake holders on impact and importance of projects.

#### e. Metra

No report provided

#### f. Pace

Mr. Andrews reported that the Pace board has appointed Linda Metzger as interim Executive Director effective January 1, 2022. Mr. Andrews then mentioned some goals Pace has for 2022 which include: begin electrification of North Division to be completed by 2026; implementing new service and exploring pilot projects; construction of ADA paratransit transfer facilities; kick off of the Pulse Dempster line construction in the spring; construction of a new CNG facility in Wheeling; and, focusing on promoting new job openings. Mr. Andrews also highlighted a new 7 day and 30 day pass in coordination with CTA that can be used on both systems.

#### g. Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways

Mr. Wright reported that the Invest in Cook application is now open, and a workshop will be held on Wednesday, January 26. Mr. Wright also noted that there would be \$8.5 million available for the projects this year.

Mr. Czarnota presented an updated status sheet for the FFY 2021-2025 programs and highlighted changes in the letting dates.

#### V. 2022 STP-L Call for Projects

Mr. Czarnota reported present a brief overview of STP funding requirements, a timeline of important dates to remember for the Call for Projects and North Shore

Council specific application requirements. He also encouraged members to apply with any project that could be ready for construction within the next 5 years as the council is trying to "over program" during this Call for Projects.

#### Regional collaboration to power electric vehicle development

CMAP recently hosted more than 30 individuals from government agencies, community organizations, and businesses as part of a new collaborative initiative to plan for electric vehicle charging stations. CMAP will convene stakeholders throughout the region to develop a shared vision that can make electric vehicles and charging stations more accessible and equitable to use in northeastern Illinois.

#### **Program Status Updates**

#### **CRRSAA Program**

On December 27, 2020, Title IV of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) was enacted. This Act included a local government component that resulted in the allocation of \$42,647,247 to be programmed and managed by CMAP. In the fall of 2021, the STP Project Selection Committee and local councils of mayors selected 33 individual project phases to be fully or partially funded with CRRSAA funding. The Regional CRRSAA Program Status Report and Regional CRRSAA Accounting Summary were updated in February 2022.

## Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) and Transportation Alternatives (TAP-L)

The next CMAQ Project Selection Committee (PSC) meeting was held on April 14, 2022, and the committee's next meeting is scheduled for **June 23, 2022**. <u>Meeting materials</u> are posted on CMAP's Legistar page one week in advance of the meetings. #### **Regional Safety Action Agenda**

CMAP is continuing its work to improve traffic safety and address the growing number of fatalities and injuries. Staff is wrapping up a policy paper on speed management and continuing work on a bicycle and pedestrian safety policy paper. Our Safety Resource Group met for the third time in October to discuss the initial recommendations for speed management and will convene again this spring to discuss implementation steps and initial bicycle and pedestrian safety recommendations. Three LTA safety projects are in progress in Calumet City, Bellwood and Riverdale to address multimodal traffic safety at intersections and along corridors. The Regional Speed Data project will begin this spring, which will analyze speed probe data to understand patterns of speeding and target countermeasures. An update on the group's work was presented at the January 25, 2022 Council of Mayors meeting.

#### **CMAP Products and Data**

#### **Fair Housing Month**

April is Fair Housing Month, a time to recognize the role housing plays in supporting an inclusive and thriving region. ON TO 2050 highlights the importance of a housing supply that responds to northeastern Illinois' changing demographics. These changing demographics increase the need for senior housing, accessible housing, and housing with easy access to services and amenities.

#### **Examining the prevalence of local development incentives**

Local governments often use tax incentives to encourage development and strengthen their communities. But there can be drawbacks. ON TO 2050 <u>calls for incentive reform</u> that will improve the transparency and effectiveness of these tools.

A new CMAP report, <u>Local development tax incentives</u> in northeastern Illinois, provides analysis on the prevalence of local incentives in the region. The report focuses on common types of incentives, including sales tax rebates, incentive classification systems, property tax abatements, and tax increment financing. It also recommends ways to reduce the need for incentives in the region and improve their use where they prove necessary.

#### CMAP Updates – April 13, 2022

The <u>findings</u> highlight the importance of using the best practices identified in CMAP's guide Improving local development incentives.

#### **Community Data Snapshots**

In August 2021, CMAP updated its <u>Community Data Snapshots</u> with <u>new data from the 2020 Census</u>. These data-rich snapshots — one for each of the region's 284 municipalities, 77 Chicago neighborhoods, and seven counties — summarize demographics, housing, employment, transportation habits, and other key details. They help local leaders and the public track progress and make informed decisions in their communities.

The 2021 census data has been incorporated into the General Population Characteristics table, which includes information on total population, total households, average household size, and percent population change since 2010 and 2000. Raw data, including more detail, is available on the <u>Data Hub</u>.

#### **RTA Launches Online Portal for Reduced, Free Ride Permits**

The RTA launched Fare Programs Online, a web-based portal for reduced fare and ride free permits for seniors and customers with disabilities. The portal aims to increase access to these programs. Apply, replace, and renew at <a href="Fares.RTAChicago.org">Fares.RTAChicago.org</a>.

#### **Funding Opportunities**

#### Local Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) call for applications

IDOT is now accepting funding applications for FY 2024 infrastructure safety projects aimed at reducing fatalities and serious injuries on roads within the local highway system. IDOT will continue to prioritize the selection of projects that address the 2017 Illinois Strategic Highway Safety Plan emphasis areas such as roadway departures, hazardous intersections, and pedestrian conflicts. IDOT will also prioritize projects that protect Vulnerable Road Users such as pedestrians and bicyclists. IDOT intends to commit \$30.6 million for the FY 2024 cycle. The federal funding level per project remains at a maximum 90 percent of the total eligible improvement cost. Eligible phases include preliminary engineering, design, construction, and construction engineering. Applications are due by **Friday, June 17, 2022 at 5:00 PM**. More information can be found here.

#### **Transit 5311 Consolidated Vehicle Procurement**

IDOT is now accepting <u>applications</u> for grants to provide public transportation providers with paratransit vehicles. Municipalities and local governments, as well as nonprofit agencies providing specialized transportation to seniors or individuals with disabilities, are encouraged to apply. The deadline to apply is **May 2, 2022**.

#### Research in Illinois to Spur Economic Recovery (RISE) Local and Regional Planning Grant

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity is awarding funds to create or update local and regional plans to accelerate economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible entities include counties, municipalities, other local units of government, and economic development organization. Award amounts range from \$10,000-\$75,000 for coverage areas with populations of up to 75,000 residents, and from \$10,000 - \$150,000 for coverage areas with populations of more than 75,000 residents. Applications are due on **May 9, 2022**. More info is available on the <u>NOFO</u>.

#### **RTA Access to Transit**

#### CMAP Updates – April 13, 2022

RTA announced a Call for Projects for their Access to Transit program, which funds small-scale capital projects that improve access to the regional transit system for pedestrians and bicyclists. <u>Application materials</u>, a <u>program guide</u>, <u>FAQ</u>, and <u>recorded webinar</u> can be found on the RTA website. Applications are due by **Friday**, **May 20**. Contact <u>Michael Horsting</u>, Manager of Local Planning, with any questions about the program.

#### \$2.9 billion in IIJA funding available for major projects

The U.S. Department of Transportation <u>announced</u> that \$2.9 billion in grant funding is available for major infrastructure projects of regional or national significance under the IIJA. State, regional, and local governments will be able to use a single application to pursue grant funding through three separate programs either established or reauthorized by the infrastructure law. Each of the funding opportunities has slightly different statutory rules that are described in detail in the <u>Notice of Funding Opportunity</u>. Applications are due by **Monday, May 23**.

## Illinois Tollway Update - April 2022

## Tollway Leadership

Following the retirement of Tollway Board Chairman Will Evans in February, Governor JB Pritzker appointed Dorothy Abreu as the new Illinois Tollway Board Chairwoman brings over 20 years of experience in financial services, significant public sector experience and an active track record of service to the community. Abreu is currently a senior vice president for PNC's Corporate and Institutional Banking group, where she leads the delivery of financial solutions and banking advisory services to public institutions and non-profit organizations in the state. In particular, she has worked with clients to manage pandemic-related disruptions and operational funding needs. She has also led financing for high-impact projects focused on driving economic development and affordable housing in Illinois' low- to moderate-income communities.

In addition, Lanyea Griffin, Deputy Chief of Program Implementation and 22-year engineering veteran, was named Interim Executive Director effective April 1, following the resignation of Executive Director José Alvarez. Griffin joined the agency in 2013 and has been an integral part of the engineering team. Since 2018, Griffin has been serving as a Deputy Chief of Program Implementation overseeing the Tollway's \$4 billion Central Tri-State Tollway (I-294) Project. During her eight-year tenure at the Illinois Tollway, Griffin also managed design for the eastern end of the \$2.5 billion Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) rebuilding and widening completed in 2017, including delivery of the region's first SmartRoad with automated traffic management. In addition, she managed construction to deliver Phase One of the \$719 million I-294/I-57 Interchange, creating the first connection between the two interstates in south suburban Chicago.

#### 2022 Capital Program

The Tollway's 2022 Capital Program calls for investing \$1.49 billion with \$296.8 million budgeted for systemwide roadway and bridge repairs to keep the existing Tollway system in good repair, along with funding for key projects including:

- \$439.9 million to continue planning and construction for the new I-490 Tollway and new interchanges connecting to the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90), Tri-State Tollway (I-294), the Illinois Route 390 Tollway, as well as providing direct access in and out of O'Hare International Airport as part of the Elgin O'Hare Western Access Project.
- \$690.1 million to continue design and reconstruction work for the Central Tri-State Tollway (I-294) Project.
- \$46.2 million to complete construction of the I-294/I-57 Interchange.
